A new king of Egypt not knowing Joseph's deeds Arose and said "These Israelites multiply at such speeds They're mightier than we, so lest enemies they become Put taskmasters over them to severely afflict every one".

But the children of Israel worked hard and with vigour As Egyptians made them slaves serving with rigour. The more affliction upon them the more they grew Till Egypt's king went to midwives saying "This you will do".

"Of these Hebrew women you will kill all sons they bear But all of the female babes born those you can spare". Fearing God and His law,murder they would not commit Making excuses to the king of Israel's women lively and fit.

> The king then declared "This decree I deliver Every son that is born cast it into the river!" An Israelite woman who had a goodly child Hid him three months while an ark she styled.

Made of bulrushes, she daubed it so it wouldn't sink.
Then laid it in the flags down by the rivers brink.
She placed the child therein to float on the water
Saying to his sister "Go watch over him my daughter"

Perchance then came down Pharoah's daughter to bathe Her maidens spied the ark so she said "Go on in and save And fetch it to me". When she opened it up the babe wept Having compassion on him she said "He will be kept".

The babe's sister came along offering to find a nurse
Calling her mother to whom Pharoah's daughter said "I'll imburse,
If you will nurse this child, then when he is grown
Bring him back to me and I will make him my own".

He then became her son and she called his name Moses For she drew him out of the water from where he reposes. This Moses went to visit his brethren one day, when a Hebrew Was being smitten by an Egyptian, Moses very angry grew.

In his anger he slew the smiter and hid him in the sand
Then the next day he went back fighting was again at hand.
Two Hebrew's this time. He said "Why kill your fellow man then?"
They said "Who made you a judge over us, will you now kill again?"

Pharoah on hearing was angry and wanted then Moses to slay
But fearing for his life, Moses from his face fled away.
Arriving in Midian he sat down to rest by a well
The prince's seven daughters needed help he could tell.

They drew water for the trough to water the flock But the shepherds intervened driving away all the stock. He helped them succeed then at home their father they told He said "Bring him home to eat don't leave him out in the cold".

With this man and his family Moses was content to dwell

He was given for wife Zipporah the daughter of Reuel.

She gave him his first son they named Gershom, born in that land

"For" he said "I've been a stranger and as a foreigner I stand".

Meanwhile in Egypt in the process of time
Israelites cried to God because of bondage, all Pharoah's design.
God then remembered the covenant He'd made long before
With Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, for to bless them he had swore.

To their offspring He had respect and would then send to save These people now living in Egypt as slaves whose distress was grave. Meanwhile Moses was keeping his father in law's flock of sheep And while tending he took them to the desert very deep.

He came to the back side of Horeb the mount Where a bush was on fire but did not surmount. So he turned to see why this fire kept on burning God called out to him when He saw him turning.

"Moses, Moses" He called. Moses replied "Here am I"
God said "Take your shoes off your feet before you come by,
For the ground is holy whereupon you stand
I am the God of your father's, now your people need a hand".

"They are in sorrow and without all contradiction
Their need is very great as they suffer in affliction.
For their delivery I am come and to Pharoah you will go
To bring My people out and on them blessings I will bestow".

"Who am I" cried Moses, " to do this great deed
"I will be with you" God said "As My children you lead".
Cried Moses "What name will I say when they test me with exam
To ask who has sent me?" God said "Say I AM THAT I AM".

"He is your Father and I AM sent me to you
To answer your cries for He knows what you go through.
He will bring you out of affliction you suffer
Helping if Pharoah won't heed and makes things tougher".

God said "I'll stretch out My hand and smite with all My wonder So you can journey three days and sacrifice to Me out yonder, In the wilderness where you'll have gone with favour Of the Egyptians you'll spoil and then their riches you'll savour".

Said Moses "Why would they listen to me or obey my voice?"

God said "Miracles I will give you so they'll have no choice.

Take this rod in your hand and a serpent it'll become instead".

Moses in his fright dropped the rod and quickly fled.

Said God "Put forth your hand and take it by the tail It'll become a rod again, these signs to them will prevail. They'll listen as you prove I AM sent you to that land As you bring forth another sign, that of a leprous hand".

"Then some water you can take up out of the river Pour it on the dry land and blood to them it will deliver". "But God my words You know" said Moses, I'm not a man of speech". "Who made your mouth?" said God, "now go,I'll be with you to teach".

"O my Lord, send I pray by the hand of whom You will".

God's anger rose against Moses but He was with him still.

"Your brother Aaron, a Levite is very eloquent

He's coming now to meet you for to go with you he's sent".

"You'll tell him all the words I'll give to you to tell I'll be with his mouth, as your spokesman he will speak well. You'll be to him as God so now take your rod and go". Moses went back to family and to see father in law Jethro.

He said "My brethren back in Egypt have a very great need I must go back to see them". To this Jethro gave him heed. "Go in peace" he said to Moses. God said "Take your wife And sons, don't fear for all are dead in Egypt who sought your life".

"Tell Pharoah, Israel is My firstborn, him you must let go If you will not do this My punishment you will know. You firstborn I will slay, so set My children free Then the punishment you could suffer will not have to be". Travelling to Egypt by the inn the Lord met him on the way His intention clearly evident, him He intended to slay.

Zipporah took a sharp stone and cut foreskin off her son "A bloody husband you are to me because of the circumcision".

Moses travelled on to meet his brother at the mount They kissed then of all that had transpired Moses gave account. Together they gathered the elders and Aaron as he'd been told Performed signs and wonders and spoke out loud and bold.

The people heard all they were told and very much believed Bowing down their heads in worship, so grateful and relieved. The two brothers went next to Pharoah to ask at God's behest For freedom for Israel's people, this their solemn request.

God said "Now you will see what before Pharoah I will perform With strong hand he'll set them free or his land I will deform.

By the name of God Almighty I came to your father's

But by my name Jehovah I was not known to your brother's".

"My covenant is with them to take them out and into Canaan Strangers they'll be but will have good things with no restraining. I'll redeem you all with judgement and with a stretched out arm And take you for a people who will come to no harm".

But the bondage continued very cruel and the days very long They despaired of Moses now their burdens were even more strong. "They won't listen" moaned Moses, Pharoah is now likewise For I'm of uncircumcised lips and one he does despise".

The heads of the father's houses with them and their sons Were noted to be brought out with all their little ones. God said "Moses you are one I have made unto Pharoah a god Aaron your brother a prophet with you as you carry the rod".

At the time of going to Pharoah Aaron was aged eighty three Moses was three years younger, four score years that would be. God said "Cast down now your rod, let a serpent Pharoah behold". "Wise men and sorcerers come forth!" cried Pharoah quite bold.

They too made theirs turn to serpents but were amazed when Aaron's rod swallowed theirs.but still Pharoah hardened again.

God said "Go out to the water at the day's new dawning

Pharoah goes out there first thing in the morning.

Take the rod and use it again and if Pharoah hasn't learned Smite it on the waters and into blood then they'll be turned.

All the fish will then die and the waters they will stink".

This would leave the people with no water to bathe or drink.

To add to Egyptian troubles their magicians copied this feat Pharoah's heart was hardened, their request he would not meet. Now all the land to the borders was covered over with frogs In the houses, bedchambers, ovens and kneading troughs.

Their magicians then made more. Pharoah said "This is enough!

Take away these pesky frogs and I'll be no longer tough".

Moses asked "When will it be then and we'll make them all depart?"
"Tomorrow" said Pharoah. "Right" said Moses "then we will start".

Dead frogs were lying everywhere and the stench quite extreme Surely they could go now, he would let them it would seem.

But with the frogs now all dead and this needed respite

Pharoah hardened his heart, so the next plague came to light.

The land filled up with lice, man beast and in all the dust of earth The magicians could not do it though they tried for all their worth. "This is the finger of God" they said, but Pharoah would not heed Stubbornly resisting. Then God said, "Another plague you'll need".

"Your land will now be covered with swarms of flies I'll sever My people in Goshen, this separation I'll devise. It will be a sign between your people and Mine And tomorrow I will show you by this identifying sign".

"I will let you go" said Pharoah "But you mustn't go too far".

"So I'll entreat these flies" said Moses "to go from where you are".

But again Pharoah reneged and hardened like a rock

Even though the flies died, so the next plague came upon his stock.

Sheep,oxen,asses and camels,cattle and horses suffered a murrain A very grevious illness, but Israel was protected again. They lost none of their stock but Egypt's cattle all died Nevertheless Pharoah stayed hard although so sorely tried.

God said "Take handfuls of ashes Moses, sprinkle them towards heaven Do this in the sight of Pharoah who is a man so full of leaven. To humble him again boils will break forth on them all With blains to afflict them, on man and beast they will fall".

The magicians then went back because of the boils

But Pharoah opposing them, for another plague spoils.

"Alright" God said "you'll now have My plagues on your heart
On your servants and people if you won't let My people depart".

"In this next pestilence to come on you My power I'll show You'll be cut off from earth if you don't let them go. I have raised you for this so that I may reveal My power That My name be declared throughout earth from this hour".

"Soon your next trial is coming, raining down grevious hail Such as you've not had in Egypt but it is coming without fail. Gather your stock under cover or those left out in the field Along with your servants will suffer, it will not be repealed".

Down came the thunder hail and fire right along the ground But up in the land of Goshen no damage was to be found. "This is enough" cried Pharoah, "the Lord for me entreat Take the thunderings and hail, I don't want any repeat".

He said "You'll stay no longer, you can go now as you ask.
To worship your God as you want and I'll give you no more task".
At that time the barley was in ear and the flax was bolled
Wheat and rye were not smitten, hail hadn't them rolled.

This hard hearted Pharoah sinned yet some more Saying "I've changed my mind, you'll continue as before!" So locusts were sent to cover all the face of the earth Eating up every tree, thus shortage of food caused a dearth. Servants came to see Pharoah saying "This land is destroyed How long do you make us suffer?" These many pleas they employed. Upon the land now blew strong wind all day and all night, Bringing locusts which darkened the land and caused much fright.

Any fruit which was left on trees or herbs that had survived Were now eaten by these insects which had so thickly arrived. "Take them away" now pleaded Pharoah, with obvious zest So God caused a mighty strong wind to blow up from the west.

Into the Red Sea they were blown but again Pharoah did not change. God said "Stretch your hand up to heaven, thick darkness I'll arrange".

Then followed three days of darkness, no light to come or go

But in the land of Goshen for the Israelites it was not so.

This discomfort for the Egyptians still would not dislodge This stubborn leader's insistence Israelite freedom he'd dodge. To Moses he said "Get you from me, take heed to yourself If you ever see my face again that will end your good health".

He said "Go! Leave your flocks with us and let your herds be stayed".
"No" said Moses, "we must take them with us, our God must be obeyed,
One last plague is coming on you from the Lord to be released
At midnight will die your firstborn of man and of every beast".

Moses in the heat of anger said "We'll then go and be free But first your servants will come and all bow down to me. There'll be a great cry throughout all your land When the death of your firstborn takes place as planned".

Then God began revealing to Aaron and to Moses
The understanding of time and all that He proposes.
He said "This month begins the year and on day number ten
You'll take a lamb or kid out to kill and I will tell you when".

"You will kill it in the evening of the fourteenth day
Strike it's blood on the door posts so the death angel I'll keep away.
The lamb must have no blemish and be a male of the first year
You'll roast it then with fire and eat it without any fear".

"Eat it with herbs that are bitter and with unleavened bread Eat it all, the purtenance with the legs and the head. If any part of it remains then burn it up with fires So that nothing of it is left, that is what your God requires". "For it is the Lord's passover to be observed that very night Firstborn of all Egyptians, man and beast of them I'll smite. Everyone of you will eat your bread baked minus any leaven These days you must observe, all the number being seven".

Moses then gathered the elders relating all he'd been told "You will teach them to your children, these things that will unfold".

At midnight then as promised the death angel passed them by Taking so many lives in Egypt there was heard a mournful cry.

So urgent were the people they said "Leave Egypt now and haste Begone! Or we'll all be dead men, you've made our land a waste.

Take with you our riches, as much as you can hold Of our raiment of our jewels. of our silver and our gold".

As they carried all to Rameses it was a very great array
Of the Israelites and multitude, with all stock on Passover Day.
They baked their bread unleavened as they had been forewarned
They observed this night rejoicing thanking God as daylight dawned.

More instruction regarding Passover God gave Moses and Aaron to give Saying "Only those circumcised are to partake or they will not live".

"And when you have your firstborn they must be sanctified unto Me When you come to the land I promised into which I set you free, You'll remember all this service in the first month of the year It will be a sign to remind you and in your mind you'll keep it near".

Leaving Succoth then they travelled out into the wilderness Going toward the Red Sea to cross, leaving behind much duress. They carried with them Jacob's bones as they had promised him Travelling on to Etham then in the light that did not dim.

For the Lord went on before them to lead them by the way
In the pillar of the cloud which was with them to stay.
For He lit their way up brightly with a pillar of fire by night
To encourage and protect them it was always in their sight.

God said "I will be honoured by Pharoah and all his host Travel between Migdol and the sea and encamp on the coast, Against Baalzephon where I'll again harden his heart He'll regret then what he has done in letting you depart". So Pharoah pursued them with chariots and with horsemen Planning to overtake Israel who cried out to God then, And complaining to Moses about their vulnerable state Saying "It was better in Egypt than to face this certain fate".

Moses then counselled them saying "For you God will fight He'll put the pillar of cloud between them and us this night, For them it will be dark and you'll see the next wonder will be Performed by God for you, by dividing the water of the red Sea".

Moses then stretched out the rod right over the waters In sight of all the adults with their sons and daughters. A strong wind from the east blew,the waters formed a high wall As the Israelites travelled across trusting the waters would not fall.

Moses stretched out the rod early as day was dawning The waters closed over the enemy completely that morning. Not one had survived and the Israelites their wares collected. These thrown up on the shore, all these goods so unexpected.

For the triumph was so glorious that He did to them afford.

Miriam and the women sang to the Lord they praised

Accompanied by timbrels, their voices joyfully raised.

Then their travels they continued to the wilderness of Shur
Where they found no water and cried out how thirsty they were.
When coming to Marah bitter waters were all they could find
"It's impossible to drink" cried the people, "why be so unkind!"

This was said to Moses whom God told, "Go, make the waters sweet

So the people can drink of it and be then fully replete

Cast this tree in the water and there'll be a great change

If you'll hearken and obey Me your good health I'll arrange".

"From all the diseases of Egypt you'll be kept clear
I am the God that heals you, they will not come near".
The next stopover was at Elim, their journey ceased when
They came to twelve wells of water, palm trees three score and ten.

After departure from Egypt, by the second month fifteenth day
The children said to Moses "It had been better for us in Egypt to stay,
For we are all hungry but there we ate our bread to the full
As we sat by the flesh pots, we should be there still".

"Behold" said the Lord "from heaven your bread will rain I'll prove you whether you'll now from sin refrain. It will come down to you daily with double the sixth day And flesh in the evening will be coming without delay".

Quails came so thickly they covered all over the camp
In the morning around the host lay dew all damp.
When the sun had dried it up there lay hoar frost on the ground
Upon the face of the wilderness this small thing quite round.

"What is it?" cried the children for they could not know.

So they called it manna. God said "daily this I'll bestow.

You'll go out and gather an omer, but I'm giving this warning

Do not leave any of it up, it must be all gone by morning".

Ignoring this instruction the manna became rank.

As they left it till the morning thus it bred worms and stank.

Said God "The sixth day of preparation go out and gather double

Resting on the morrow the Sabbath so your bread will cause no trouble".

Again with disobedience they went out but could find none "How long refuse you to obey Me" God said, "each and every one.

Put an omer in a pot store it up in the expectations

Of your need to show your staple to the coming generations".

"Lay it up before the testimony to be sure that it's kept right
This honey flavoured wafer like coriander seed white".

N Now on from the wilderness of sin no water at next stop Rephidim
The people were angry with Moses and ready to stone him.

"Is the Lord among us or not?" cried those of Israelite stock God said "Give them water, with your rod smite Horeb the rock". Then at Rephidim came Amelek ready with Israel to fight So Moses Aaron and Hur went up the hill in the people's sight.

Moses held the rod high in the air as the battle ensued Whilst it was held aloft they had success in this fued. But each time Moses let down the rod Amelek would prevail So they held up his arms to ensure they would not fail.

God said "Write this for a memorial and rehearse it in Joshua's ears I'll put out remembrance of Amelek after wars in the coming years".

Then came the priest of Midian, Moses father in law Jethro
Bringing Zipporah with Gershom and Elieser his sons also.

Jethro rejoiced when told of wonderful works God had done Rescuing from Egypt's Pharoah all Israel, everyone. He observed the judgements Moses gave all day long To the people lining up, a very great throng.

"What is this you do" he cried, "you'll surely wear away My advice I now give you so listen to what I say. Make your choice from the people,men of truth who are able To rule tens, fifties, hundreds, thousands, and keep all stable".

"The hard causes to you they can bring for your guidance All the smaller matters you'll leave to their contrivance". Moses implemented his suggestions, Jethro departed bye and bye Their travels they then continued to the wilderness of Sinai.

The same day that they left Egypt they came to this destination God told Moses from the mount "Tell the children of this nation, Be ready against the third day, prepare for what I'll relate Be sanctified with clothes washed, My law I will dictate".

The third day Mt Sinai was all of a smoke and the trumpet sounded loud.

The people trembled there before the mount, a very large crowd.

Moses climbed the mountain, God told him just what to do

"Bring Aaron with you next time, the rest must not break through".

"The bounds are set around so the mount they will not touch
It will be the death of anyone who decides to do as much".
God gave his laws to His people who moved off with fear
Saying "You speak to us Moses what God tells, we'll die with Him so near".

The table with the furniture, candlesticks with seven lamps to hold
To give light to all that are therein made from pure beaten gold".

"Ten curtains made of fine linen coupled together to form a tent A covering made of ram's and badger's skins, all without rent. Boards of Shittim wood along each side, twenty held with silver sockets Make a veil to cover the holy place with hooks of gold to lock it".

"It'll be of blue purple and scarlet, with cherubim it shall it be made Behind it you will place the ark so to all it's not displayed".

Burnt offerings, altar, tabernacle and court directions they were taught Breast plate with twelve precious stones with ephod to be wrought.

In the breastplate of judgement Urim and Thummim was to be placed For Aaron and the priests to wear, all these correctly spaced.

A golden bell and pomegranite to be on the hem of it round about That Aaron not die on entry to the holy place and when coming out.

"Make a plate of gold quite pure, engrave HOLINESS TO THE LORD On the mitre worn by Aaron, on his forehead these words you'll record With consecration of the priesthood, sacrifices offered at the door Of the tabernacle by these priests, anointed lineage evermore".

"This is a perpetual statute, these rites you'll not forget
Seven days of consecration, all these standards must be met
With offerings morning and evening, at the door I'll meet with you
As I dwell with Israel, sanctifying priests and tabernacle too".

"Make an altar to burn the incense, overlay it with gold that's pure Burn it morning and evening, nothing strange to come near it to be sure. Make an atonement on the horns of it, yearly this will be done Take a sum of the children of Israel, let them give a ransom each one".

"That there be no plagues among you half a shekel you will give All that are twenty and over good health they will have as they live.

Mix myrrh, cinnamon and calamus, cassia and olive oil

Holy ointment to sanctify, this mixture you will not spoil".

"Take staite, onycha and galbanum, make a mixture of sweet spice A confection like the apothecary, holy and perfumed so nice. I've given special knowledge and talent in all manner of workmanship To help you accomplish these things and make sure you do not slip".

Said God to Moses "Tell the children My Sabbaths you will keep If you dare to do any work on them death you'll surely reap. For they are days that are holy a sign between Israel and Me To be kept through your generations, perpetual covenant it is to be".

"In six days the Lord your God made the heaven and the earth You'll rest as He did on the seventh every one of you from birth". The two tables of testimony written with God's very own finger Were given then to Moses, told to take them down and not to linger.

For the people had grown restless, saying to Aaron "God's you'll make So they can go before us on the journeyings that we take.

As for this Moses we know not what has become of him".

Aaron took their earrings, succumbing to their ungodly whim.

"We will see who is on the Lord's side, let him come now unto me".

All the Levites gathered to him but many others dead would be.

Three thousand men were slaughtered, a lesson sadly learned

Moses went to God to intercede, pleading for these people so smitten Saying "If You'll not forgive them blot me out of the book You've written". God said "Now go and enter into the land for an angel goes before To this land of milk and honey, with peace and prosperity in store".

Moses then took the tabernacle and pitched it far from the camp All those that would seek the Lord, to go out would have to tramp. God came down with Moses to talk to him face to face In a cloudy pillar he descended saying "With Me you've found grace".

"Show me Your glory" said Moses. "I'll make all My goodness go before"
Said God "Stand up on that rock, I'll show My back parts but no more.
Hew you two more tables of stone, the same as the ones you broke
Come to Me on Mt Sinai, a covenant I make and will not revoke".

"To drive our the inhabitants before you, from the land you go to possess You'll make no covenant with them for they would lead you to distress.

Three times in a year you'll come, all your people that are male
In Unleavened Bread and first fruits, ingathering at years end without fail".

As Moses came down he knew not that the skin of his face shone
The people would not come near till a veil over his face he would don.
Then he asked them for an offering, from those of a willing heart
They supplied then all that was needed so the tabernacle could start.

The men of talent and wisdom those zealous and believing All worked on this beautiful building, women spinning and weaving. The offering kept on coming till told there was more than enough So they were restrained from giving, told there was sufficient stuff.

To fashion the curtains, boards and bars, ark, mercy seat and veil The candlestick with branches six, all done with excellent detail. Altars of incense and burnt offering, shovels, basins and each pot The flesh hooks and the firepans, vessels made of brass, the lot.

The sum of the tabernacle was noted, those appointed then counted. The gold for the Levites service in the holy place great store amounted. Half a shekel of silver was given from each one, twenty and more Six hundred, three thousand, five fifty men all added to this store.

The stones of the ephod were onyx enclosed in ouches of gold
As were the stones of the breastplate spaced in four rows all told.
The first row was a carbuncle, a sardius and a topaz
An emerald, sapphire and diamond the second row has.

The third contained an amethyst an agate and a ligure
Fourth had a jasper, onyx and beryl encased in gold that was pure.
Each stone was according to the names of the children of Israel
One for each of the tribes engraved in the finest detail.

So all the work of the tabernacle was now completed and done They brought it all to Moses to examine the work of everyone. He declared that it was just as the Lord had commanded it be Pleased with all their workmanship he blessed them thankfully.

"The first day of the first month second year was the tabernacle erected The testimony put in the ark under the mercy seat as projected.

The veil of covering and all contents were then set in place
Moses, Aaron and sons washed in the laver, uncleaness to erase.

When it was all completed the tent was covered with a cloud When the Lord's glory filled it entry to Moses was not allowed. Day by day it was upon it, fire by night in sight of the tent When it was taken up off it then on with their travels they went.
